# Featured Speakers

## Dr. Kathleen Gallagher

Kathleen (Kate) Gallagher, Ph.D. is an educational psychologist and early childhood professional, with over 30 years experience teaching and leading early childhood programs. Dr. Gallagher designs and evaluates interventions that support the development and wellbeing of young children, families, and early childhood professionals. Her research and professional guidance have been published in books, journals and media publications. Dr. Gallagher's ability to communicate messages regarding high quality early care and education are manifest in presentations and workshops with a wide range of audiences, including UNC's most popular TED talk of 2015: *The Healthy Child: Assembly Required* and *TEDxMemphis: Assembly of the Healthy Child: The Next Steps*.



## Dr. Miriam Westheimer Coach Sidney Moncrief



Dr. Miriam Westheimer has worked in the fields of education, social service and nonprofit management serving as a founding executive director, international director, board president, project manager and organizational/educational consultant.

She has spent the last 20 years adapting and disseminating a home-based, early childhood program (HIPPI). She served HIPPI as the founding executive director and later built the interna-

tional network of HIPPI programs among the 12 participating countries.

She has a small consulting practice that allows her to work with diverse organizations and individuals as advisor, mentor, manager and facilitator. Her consulting clients include Arkansas Children's Hospital, Carnegie Corporation of New York, Family Support America, Families and Work Institute, The Finance Project, Jewish Theological Seminary of America and Quality Evaluation Design.

Dr. Westheimer co-authored the best-selling international textbook and multi-media series, *Focus on Grammar*, now in its third edition. Additionally, based on her experience teaching English in Israel, she helped conceive and create a global course to teach teen-agers and adults how to communicate effectively in English.

Sidney Moncrief has served on the Board of Directors for a Fortune 500 company and as president of various retail auto sales businesses. He is a five-time NBA All-Star, five-time member of the NBA All-Defensive team, a two-time NBA Defensive Player of the Year, and an NBA All-Pro. He is a former head coach and assistant coach. As a coach, Sidney Moncrief has served on the coaching staff of the Dallas Mavericks, Golden State Warriors and the Milwaukee Bucks. He also led an international team as the head consultant in Beijing, China.

Sidney is author of four books: *Sidney Moncrief: My Journey to the NBA*; *Your Passport to Reinventing You*; *Your Passport to Becoming a Valuable Team Player*; *Your Passport to Back2Basics Leadership* and the soon to be released *Your Passport to Manhood*.

He is currently managing partner of Moncrief1Team, which is a People Building Company specializing in Team Enhancement and Leadership training.

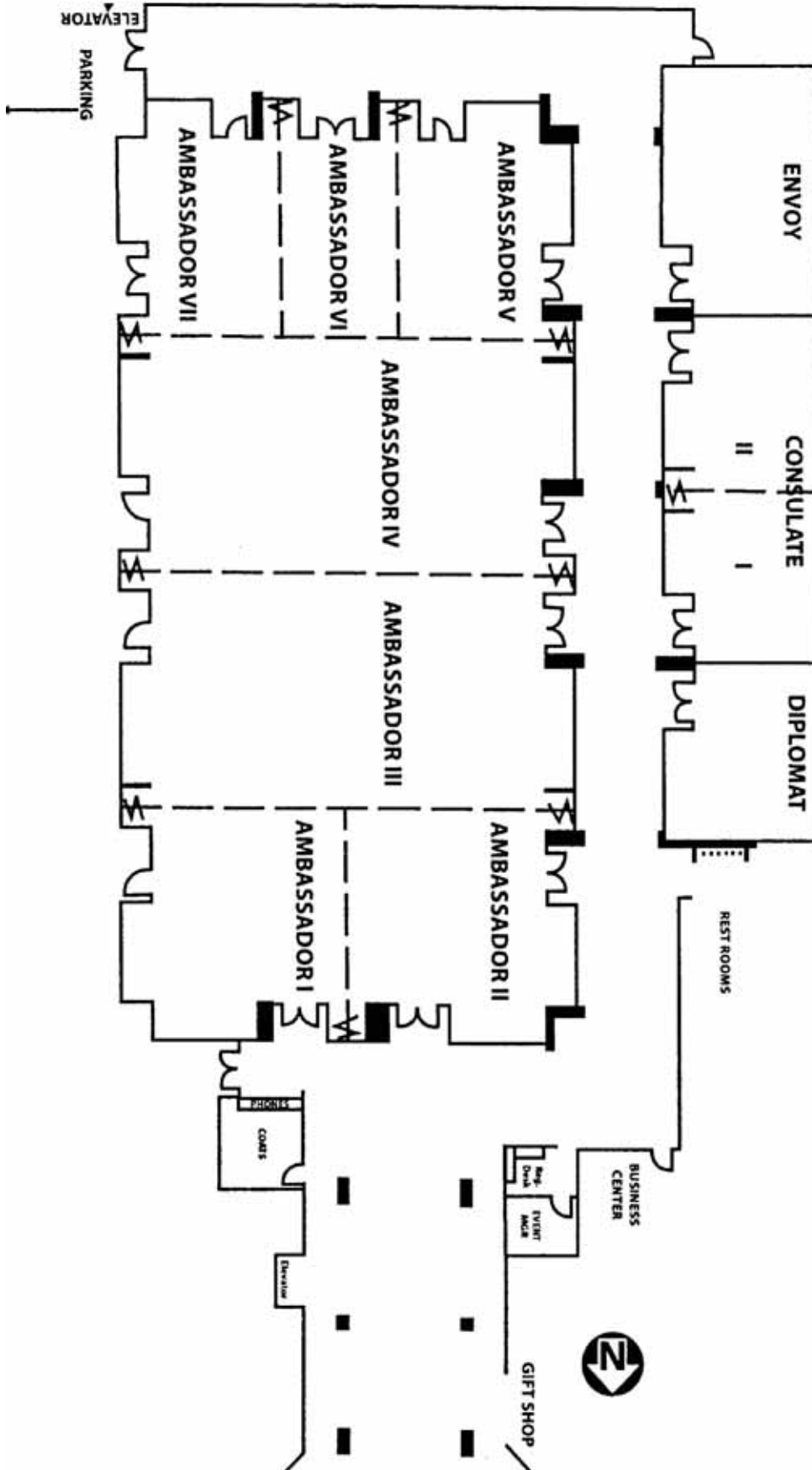
