Parental Evaluation

The following plan will be completed annually by each HIPPY Arkansas ABC program.

1. All primary caregivers (those participating in the role play with the assigned HBE) participating in the HIPPY program will be evaluated using the **"HIPPY Parent Involvement Interview"** developed by HIPPY USA.
2. The **"HIPPY Parent Involvement Interview"** will be conducted with parents for completion during the **first 2 weeks** of program involvement and during the **last 2 weeks** of program involvement, for **each program year**.
3. All HIPPY Arkansas Parental Pre and Post Evaluations from each site will be submitted to HIPPY USA **Quarterly**. HIPPY USA will contract with an independent evaluator to analyze the data from the parent evaluations.

The following plan will be completed at interval, by each HIPPY Arkansas MIECHV program only.

4. All primary caregivers (those participating in the role play with the assigned HBE) participating in the HIPPY program will be evaluated by the **"Family MAP Inventory"** developed by UAMS. These questionnaires will be uploaded directly to UAMS for analysis. Local programs will utilize this data to enhance effectiveness and delivery of HIPPY programs and other related services throughout the state. Complete instructions for appropriate delivery of the **"Family MAP Inventory"** including appropriate questionnaire selection, delivery and uploading instructions are obtained during the **"Family MAP Inventory"**

Child Evaluation

The following plan will be completed at interval, by each HIPPY Arkansas program.

HIPPY Arkansas programs will use the Ages & Stages System to screen each child participating in the HIPPY Program, at interval. The **Ages & Stages Questionnaires®, Third Edition (ASQ-3™)** is a parent completed screening that pinpoints developmental progress in children between the ages of one month to 5 ½ years. The **Ages & Stages Questionnaires®: Social-Emotional, Second Edition (ASQ:SE-2™)** is a parent-completed, highly reliable system focused solely on social and emotional development in young children. The Ages and Stages System is used to accurately identify behavior and determine next steps—further assessment, specialized intervention or ongoing monitoring.

1. The age-appropriate Ages and Stages Questionnaire-3 (ASQ-3) will be completed by the primary HIPPY caregiver using the recommended guidelines provided during ASQ-3/ASQ:SE-2 Training and in accordance with primary funding source requirements.
2. MIECHV Programs' ASQ and ASQ-SE results are uploaded into ETO and then gathered by UAMS for analysis.
3. ABC/ABCSS Programs' ASQ and ASQ-SE results are uploaded into COPA and then gathered by the Arkansas Department of Child Care and Early Childhood Education (DCCECE) for analysis.
